Welcome to *The Cake*, our second production of 2020. For this month, I want to expand on the growth theme I began in my January President's Corner and give you an update about our financial growth over the past six years and a hopeful note about our audience growth.

Our development consultant Cesie Delve Scheuermann and our executive director, Lisa Joyce, have been doing a fantastic job with fundraising. While our season ticket sales have not fluctuated very much

for the past few years, our increases in donations and grants have been remarkable. Since 2014, our donations have increased by 176 percent, our sponsorships by 296 percent, and total giving, including grants, is up 460 percent.

Our new sound system is now installed. I am sure you will notice the difference starting with this production of *The Cake*. I am so thankful to Don Rogers and everyone who helped make our sound system grow into something we can really proud of this year. It took us a while to raise the needed funds but I think you will see that it was worth the effort. A special thank you to all of you among our patrons who made this possible.

Our last production, *Murder on the Orient Express*, was a rousing hit with audiences and a total sellout. We even added an extra performance and sold it out! I am so thankful to director Isaac Joyce-Shaw and his fabulous cast and crew for working so hard to create this great show and bring a new level of technical magic to our stage. A special shout out to Liz Rogers for the projections.

We hope *Murder* added some continuing new theater goers to our ranks. Growing the audience, especially adding younger patrons to our mix, is always a challenge for theaters everywhere. We are no exception. However, reaching new audiences is a crucial part of staying competitive when there are more entertainment options in Salem than ever before. But, we also try to keep a balance between new audience development and loyalty to our continuing patrons. We hope you will all bring a new friend to the theater this season. Share the love.

And of course, thank you for your continued generosity and support of Pentacle Theatre. A theater is not a theater without you, our audience.

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
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## **Becky Bond**

# Attention all high school graduating seniors

The Pentacle Theatre's Education Committee is pleased to announce that applications are being accepted for the *Bill and Phyllis Cross Pentacle Theater Scholarships* for pursuit of higher education and the arts. Three scholarships are available to qualifying high school seniors:

- The Jo Dodge Performing Arts Theater Scholarship
- The Tony Zandol Technical Arts Theater Scholarship
- The Tom Ulmer Theater Service Scholarship

To qualify, high school seniors must be graduating in the spring of 2020 and plan to attend college in the fall of 2020, whether a community college or a four-year institution. Applicants will be asked to demonstrate their experience with theater education as well as other theater involvement, including service at Pentacle Theatre. Additionally, applicants will need to report on their academic and professional goals and any special considerations of financial need. Lastly, applicants will be asked to submit a personal statement describing the impact of theater in their lives and their own contributions to the arts. For complete qualifying information, please refer to the application.

Applications are available starting February 28, 2020. You may download the application from the Pentacle Theatre website (www.pentacletheatre.org), pick up one from a local drama teacher or contact the Education Committee chair, Robert Salberg at 971-208-2799 or salberg.robert@gmail.com.

Scholarship applications are due May 1, 2020, and recipients will be notified by May 31, 2020.

The fund, established in memory of Bill and Phyllis Cross, honors these two individuals who were awarded Pentacle Theatre's highest honor of lifetime membership. While at Pentacle Theatre and during Phyllis' career as a high school drama teacher, the Crosses served as mentors and role models, inspiring those around them in performing and technical theater arts.

Jo Dodge, also a Pentacle Theatre lifetime member, has acted and directed in numerous Pentacle Theatre productions, taught acting workshops at the theater through Chemeketa Community College since 1981, and shared her love of theater with hundreds of Pentacle Theatre volunteers for 25 years.

The technical arts scholarship is awarded in honor of Tony Zandol, Pentacle Theatre's former resident designer and professional production director. In addition to his work with Pentacle Theatre, Tony worked with Children's Educational Theatre.

The late Tom Ulmer was a tireless creator and educator of theatrical arts at Pentacle Theatre, Children's Educational Theatre and Salem-Keizer School District. Pentacle Theatre honors his memory by awarding scholarship funds to a student who overcomes obstacles to give extraordinary time and effort to be involved in theater.

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
